

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

THE Penneshaw community markets are set to return to the town's football oval.

Progress association president Betty McAdam said the market season commenced on Sunday, October 1 and feature live music and an opportunity to browse Island themed and created art, craft, photography, souvenirs and jewellery.

The Penneshaw Market season lasts seven months, and is held on the first Sunday of each month from October to April, including Easter Sunday.

The markets are held on the

Dudley United Oval, adjacent to three cafes which provide coffee and refreshments.

The opening market of the season will also host the Great Dudley Bake Off organised by the Penneshaw branch of the South Australian Country Women's Association.

The bake off involves community members cooking cakes, competing for the title and includes separate entries for junior and senior classes.

All entries are sold at \$1 an item as a fundraiser for local organisations.

The KI Farmers and Artisans Market resumes at the Kingscote jetty area on the third Sunday of each month, starting on September 17, 2023, from 10am to 1pm.

SWEEEPING VIEWS ON DUDLEY

DUDLEY PENINSULA

EXPERIENCE the essence of Kangaroo Island at Dudley Wines. Sweeping clifftop views surround you as you sample Dudley's fine Kangaroo Island wines accompanied by gourmet pizzas and platters.

There's a nature play area with plenty of space for young ones to run around.

Try your hand at "golf across the gully", an opportunity to practice your golf skills for the young ones and young at heart!

Dudley Wines is run and owned by Jeff and Val Howard, their three children and their families.

The Howard family's history on Kangaroo Island dates back more than 140 years.

In the 1960s, Jeff, a fourth generation 'Islander', purchased a block, known as Porky Flat, on the south coast of the Peninsula, which he gradually turned into a successful merino sheep and cattle farm.

With the collapse of the wool industry in the early 1990s, Jeff

planted vines as an experiment, and made their first red wine in part of the old shearing shed.

They named it "Shearing Shed Red" and it was purely for their own use.

The following year they made their first commercial vintage wine, and Dudley Wines grew from there.

Dudley Wines' vineyard is in a beautiful valley at Porky Flat.

The vines are dry-grown and thrive in the rich limestone soils.

The fresh Southern Ocean breezes ensure a slow ripening season, leading to enhanced fruit concentration.

About 30 per cent of the property is still untouched native bushland and it is the isolated nature, and the pristine surrounds of the vineyard that contribute to the unique characteristics of Dudley's Wines.

Jeff's son Brodie took over the role of winemaker in 2000.

Being the owner/winemaker for over 20 years has given him the freedom to explore many techniques and develop his own winemaking style.

His range of wines are diverse, and carefully crafted



to capture and emphasise the abundant fruit characteristics presented by the Island's terroir.

Dudley Wines are proud to produce a 100 per cent Kangaroo Island product, grown and handcrafted just 15km from the cellar door.

It embraces sustainable practices in the vineyard and winery, including the use of animals to control weeds and pests - limiting chemical use,

using solar power and but no irrigation.



EMU Bay Lavender is a farm gate cafe set amongst rows of beautiful lavender.

The business makes and packages an extensive range of lavender products on site and also offers a delicious lunch menu in the cafe.

The humble story of Emu Bay Lavender began in 2001 where a small lavender garden was first planted.

And 19 years later, the farm now runs over 51 acres of land and has an estimate of 7500 lavender plants, including 12 different varieties of *Lavandula Angustifolia* and *Lavandula Intermedia*.

The business is owned by a fifth generation Island family which is continually striving to increase the farm's efficiency and sustainability.

During summer, the lavender flowers are in full bloom and ready for harvesting.

Kangaroo Island's famous Ligurian bees are busy pollinating the flowers and



begin producing the signature lavender honey.

Workers hand harvest and strip about 8000 bunches per year, and distill 10 kilograms of essential oil, used in all of the handmade therapeutic products.

It may not sound like much, but it takes about 100 kilograms of flowers to produce just one kilogram of oil.

Summer - The flowers are in full bloom and harvest takes

place by hand throughout the summer. The bees pollinate the flowers and begin producing the signature lavender honey.

Autumn - This is the time of the year lavender bushes are pruned by a third to stimulate growth, which prevents the bush from growing thin and scraggly, which can reduce the yield of flowers and oil that can be collected.

Winter - Each winter the lavender field is weeded by hand



and it's the time to take cuttings to create new plants. Guests enjoy sitting in the cosy cafe with a warm cuppa and freshly baked lavender scones from the oven.

Spring - During spring, the plants start to produce new growth and lavender flower buds begin to develop.

The cafe is open for breakfast from 9am to 11.30am and lunch is 12pm to 3pm.



THE 2023 apple harvest for Kangaroo Island Ciders was a bumper crop, with star performers

being the Old English cider varieties of Yarlington Mill, Improved Foxwhelp and Bulmers Norman.

This year, Kangaroo Island Ciders owners Graham and Mary Jones had the assistance of members of the KI Dragons dragon boaters to bring in the harvest at the orchard located at Haines.

"Like previous years, we had our problems with bird damage particularly in the early part of the season, when they demolished our rows of dessert apples in the lower part of the orchard," Graham said.

"But fortunately (the birds) found new homes in the latter part of the season to allow our cider varieties to mostly escape harm."

The traditional ciders the business makes rely upon a mix of bittersweet and bittersharp apples to provide the polyphenolic backbone to the



ciders' flavour, in much the same way that hops are used in beer making.

"These are then blended with other varieties which we grow to provide additional flavour, sweetness and acid to make our robust, full-flavoured ciders," Graham said.

"With the harvest in, the

apples have been sent to a large juicing facility on the mainland and then fermented and made into cider.

"The cider has turned out to be one of the best we have made - another memorable vintage. Cheers!"

Kangaroo Island Ciders have won numerous awards,

including a national title, with its varieties.

Kangaroo Island Ciders are available at venues around Kangaroo Island, including just a couple of stone's throw from the orchard, at Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery.





SPRINGS Road Wines was established in 1994, producing small volumes of chardonnay, shiraz, cabernet sauvignon and a cabernet sauvignon/shiraz blend.

It was founded and built by Kangaroo Island legend Roger Williams, of Roger's Deli fame.

Springs Road Wines has been owned and operated since 2016 by the owners of McLaren Vale's Battle of Bosworth Wines, Joch Bosworth and Louise Hemsley-Smith.

Joch and Louise's expansion into Kangaroo Island came fortuitously after taking their winery crew on a mystery tour of Kangaroo Island at the end of the 2016 vintage.

Joch was shopping for groceries when he saw an advertisement for Springs Road vineyards.

Recognising the potential, the property was bought and the rest is history.

"We built a cellar door off the existing shed and opened up for business in December 2018,

and launched the Springs Road wines at the same time," Louise said.

Louise loves showing off their wines and educating people about their other wines from McLaren Vale, the beautiful Cygnet River area and Kangaroo Island in general.

She said the Springs Road label was adapted from French cartographer Louis Freycinet's 1808 map of southern Australia, 'Carte Generale de la Terre Napoleon'.

Since taking over the winery at Cygnet River, just outside of Kingscote, the pair have also branched into the "Little Island" range, which includes a shiraz and a dry rose.

The Little Island wine label is inspired by the front cover of a short history of Kangaroo Island, which was published in 1951 by the Kingscote branch of the Country Women's Association (CWA).

A new wine for 2023 is the Little Island Fizz, a sparkling KI red, and there is also a new 2023 vintage of the Little Island Rose.

Soon to be released for sale is the new vintage 'Terre Napoleon' - barrel reserve shiraz - 2022.

There are plans for the



Springs Road cellar to extend its catering for children over the summer and also operate a book exchange where books can be returned to the Battle of Bosworth winery – the mother ship at Willunga.

Louise said children will be able to enjoy playing in a teepee toy tent.

"Parents can enjoy a tasting

and a glass of wine while the young folk entertain themselves out of the sun in a confined area," Louise said.

Springs Road offers a tasting experience, which includes a full tasting of its wines, plus cheese and crackers.

FRYAR'S Kangaroo Island Free Range Eggs is a family owned-and-operated business situated on Kangaroo Island's pristine farming land, producing pastured, free range eggs.

Tom and Fiona Fryar established the business in 1992, with just 400 hens on 40 hectares of land.

Today, the couple and their sons, Thomas and Jason and their wives Kirby and Bonnie, run full-beaked true free range hens over their 2000-hectare farm and employ over 25 people.

The hens live in 80 individual custom built mobile sheds on the farm, which are designed so that the hens are never locked in and are continuously free to roam as they please.

The mobile sheds provide roosting rails, nest boxes and shelter for the hens.

The hens' welfare is of the utmost importance to the Fryar family, which is why they run them at no more than 190 hens per hectare.

The mobile sheds are placed on fresh pasture giving the hens plenty of space to scratch and peck at seeds, grass and insects.

The hens' nutrition is also enhanced by a mixture of grains that are grown, harvested and crushed all on the farm.

Kangaroo Island Free Range

Eggs have maremma stock guardian dogs that live with the hens.

The dogs love living out with the hens and do a brilliant job guarding them from any predators, such as eagles and feral cats.

Eggs are collected daily and stored in a cool room to ensure they are a product of excellent freshness and quality.

The eggs are then graded and packed on the farm.

Each week, the eggs are sold and transported in refrigerated transport to stores and outlets on Kangaroo Island, Adelaide, regional South Australia, Melbourne, Sydney.

Kangaroo Island Free Range Eggs is a growing business, which the Fryar family recognise would not be where it is today without its wonderful staff members.

The team consists of 25 employees from the people who collect the eggs, tend to the dogs and hens' needs, work in the egg-processing facility, feed the birds, perform maintenance and farm duties around the farm and look after the egg sales.

Every team member is vital to the business and is the reason KI Free Range Eggs are able to produce such a high-quality product.

The business is externally audited so customers can be assured that the pastured free range hens are true free range.

KI Free Range Eggs is



certified by Humane Choice and PROOF (Pasture Raised On Open Fields).

It is also accredited under the Primary Industry and Regions SA Egg Food Safety Scheme and audited by Biosecurity SA against the National Egg Food Safety Standard.

The business has significantly

grown over the years and the Fryar family are excited to see where it is heading in future.

Michael asks people to visit the website and hope people will support regenerative farming by visiting the online shop.

"If you're visiting Kangaroo Island, please be aware we do not have a bricks and mortar visitor centre at this time, but you can get olives around the island, including the local supermarkets in Kingscote and Penneshaw," Michael said.

"Alternatively, we encourage you to visit our friends Kym and Bridgette who run a farm shop that's only 10 minutes up the road.

They're very familiar with our olive grove and offer a range of locally grown KI produce."

Kangaroo Island Olives also has a farm stay.

The recently renovated 'Little Liguria' homestead can be found nestled between our oldest olive grove and the Nepean Bay waterfront.



Named after the famous region of Northern Italy, in honour of the Ligurian olive tree and honey bee, which are both farmed on the property, the original homestead is centrally located within walking distance of the olive groves, beach, horse stables, lagoon and nature trails.

Constructed mostly from locally sourced materials, the octagonal shape is truly iconic and breathes circular, regenerative energy into the life of the home.

Having undergone a major renovation in 2019, the home offers complete privacy, while providing a centralised base

from which to visit the many attractions across the island.

The house comfortably accommodates six guests in four bedrooms. Additional single beds can be arranged (not in private bedrooms) and there's plenty of camping space.

Guests have access to the entire property but should always stick to tracks, obey signage and avoid wandering off too far.

If you have a 4WD you can drive up to the beach, otherwise it's a short walk on foot. A 4WD is recommended but not critical.

IFE is an adventure - and Ken and Amanda Rowe's adventure has been one with a true sea change.

The pair began their story in white-collar, corporate, IT and recruitment with an inner-city living lifestyle, and chose to leave it all behind for blue-collar oyster farming, tourism and food production, remote country living and to free-range their young family.

"We wanted to give our girls the freedom and safety that we had when we were growing up," Amanda said.

"They say the village raises the children and that was one of the many things we love about our Island home."

They sold their IT recruitment company in 2005 and moved to Penneshaw on Kangaroo Island then started looking for a business opportunity.

"We wanted a business that met our core values, including minimal impact on the environment and to contribute to our community," Amanda said.

"Oyster farming is a positive impact aquaculture industry that not only provides a sustainable food source, it also provides many benefits to the environment from improving water quality and nutrient cycling to providing habitats for biodiversity, carbon sequestration, removal of nitrogen and accelerating denitrification.

"It ticked the boxes for our core values."

Farming and fishing the sea has long been in both Ken and Amanda's families, so the saltwater farming seemed a fitting adventure for the two of them.

With a steep learning curve and some harsh lessons from mother nature, Ken and Amanda have created a year-round, sustainable business on Kangaroo Island.

Their careers have come pretty much full circle now with a new aquaculture farm management app developed by Ken that has been rolled out across South Australia and beyond.

So the corporate IT background and the oyster farmer became one, all through a passion to do something good for the environment.

But the business does not stop there.

Kangaroo Island Shellfish is now licensed to farm not only Pacific Oysters but also native Angasi oysters, native Blue Mussels and seaweed with a major focus being research and development into multi-trophic farming of these species.

Their vision for developing an integrated aquaculture and tourism business in the tranquil, seaside town of American River is fast becoming a reality.

Some completed projects include increased all-weather dining capacity at the Farm Shop and the development of a new



on-farm experience within their Secret Oyster Bar, The Shucking Experience.

Tuna and kingfish sashimi are now on offer, straight from Port Lincoln to American River and stored in a newly purchased -65 degree specialty freezer for optimum freshness and quality.

Coming from a background of mussel farming, they are not strangers to the industry and passionately share Amanda and Ken Rowe's vision for the Aquaculture industry in American River.

Ken, Amanda and The Oyster Farm Shop team will continue to operate as a closely aligned operation with the farm while we all work together toward the shared vision.

WILDLIFE HELP

THE Kangaroo Island Wildlife Network (KIWN) is a not-for-profit organisation whose volunteers deliver ongoing wildlife conservation programs for all species of wildlife.

This includes environmental protection and restoration, as well as emergency response and direct care for rescued, orphaned or injured wildlife.

Vehicle strike is the main reason wildlife goes into care, so the KIWN urges visitors to slow down and watch for wildlife when driving around the island.

In some good news, there are new road wildlife signs reminding drivers to slow down and to call 1300 KIWILD (549 453) when animals are injured.

Other new roadside signs remind visitors and residents of the presence of wildlife after dark.

KIWN president Katie Welz said the new signage had resulted in a six-fold increase in calls to the network hotline.

"After many years, the KI Wildlife Network is so excited that our 'Report Injured Wildlife' signs have been erected around the Island on



Department of Infrastructure and Transport roads to act as a reminder that wildlife is active on our roads," she said.

"We encourage all motorists to safely pull over when they see injured wildlife and call 1300-KIWILD for assistance."

The KIWN also provides and helps to plant trees and shrubs to support many species across the Island and the little penguin and glossy black cockatoo were just two of the focus habitat restoration projects for 2023.





Is this the rarest honey on earth?

To most people honey is just another spread on the supermarket shelf, nestled somewhere between the jams and peanut butter. But not this honey.

For a start, this honey comes from Kangaroo Island, a pristine, GM free, bee sanctuary 13 kilometres off the coast of South Australia.

Kangaroo Island is the oldest bee sanctuary in the world and home to the purest Ligurian bees on Earth. Renowned for their gentle nature, they were brought to the island in the 1880s, protected by a special act of parliament in 1885 and have been fortunate to avoid most of the diseases and contaminants that have affected other bees around the world.

This particular variety of honey was collected by the bees in 2019 from flowering gum trees called **Eucalyptus Remota** that only grow in one location on the planet: the western end of Kangaroo Island. But if that wasn't special enough, nearly all these trees were destroyed by the bushfires on the island in 2020 and will now take up to 7 years to fully regenerate.

You won't find this honey in a single supermarket, or store, anywhere in the world. There is simply not enough to go around. The limited quantity of jars have been hand packed on Kangaroo Island and they are only available in 300 gram numbered bottles from one website, ours.

As you can imagine, this honey has an authentic, pure, beautiful flavour. But taste isn't the only benefit provided by these unique bees. They also make propolis, a natural substance shown in University of Sydney research to be effective in the treatment of human cancer cells. Further investigation is being undertaken to determine the therapeutic benefits.

This honey is a rare and special treat, to be enjoyed, shared, or sent as a unique gift to friends and family around the world. Or you may choose to just keep it. Honey is the only food that doesn't need or have an expiry date. Edible honey was found in Egyptian tombs.

So, while honey lasts forever, this one will disappear very quickly.
